Throughout her career, Dr. Anita Pierre-Antoine has demonstrated a commitment to caring for the underserved, advocacy, education and mentoring. Dr. Pierre-Antoine is a board-certified family medicine physician who graduated from Duke University where she earned a B.A. degree in anthropology and Northwestern University where she earned her M.D. After graduating from Duke, she spent a year volunteering full time with hospice and attending Duke Divinity School as a PathWays Fellow before doing a research year at Duke-NUS Medical School in Singapore. After returning home to southern Florida, she partnered with her cousin to start a nonprofit in their hometown geared toward first language literacy education for Hispanic and Haitian immigrants. After losing her father to gun violence, she felt a greater calling to the community of teenagers in inner-city Chicago whom she had previously mentored. She dedicated a year of services to completing a Schweitzer Fellowship project focused on developing life skills in preparation for post-secondary education for which she received a grant from the Chicago Area Health Education Center (AHEC) Network Program. Dr. Pierre-Antoine has been successful in integrating her medical education with community building through her work with the Primary Care Leadership Program in Mississippi and Washington, where she helped community health center networks improve their capacity to serve rural and urban populations. She has demonstrated commitment to improving patient care through her research fellowship with the Center for Advancing Equity in Clinical Preventive Services. Dr. Pierre-Antoine completed her family medicine residency in southern Texas where she continued to serve as both a patient advocate and mentor. She now serves as a lead primary care physician and associate center medical director in a value-based practice in the Midwest.
