She is also a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada, an Honorary Foreign Member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and the co-chair of the Advisory Committee on Canada's Indo-Pacific Strategy. In the media, Stein has provided commentary for networks such as CBC, CTV, TVO and CNN. She has also written columns and provided commentary for *The Globe and Mail* and *The National Post*. Stein is also the co-author of the prize-winning work *The Unexpected War: Canada in Kandahar* and the editor of the acclaimed essay collection *Diplomacy in the Digital Age*. She was the Massey Lecturer in 2001 and a Trudeau Fellow. Stein was awarded the Molson Prize by the Canada Council in recognition of her outstanding contribution to public debate as a social scientist, and she has received an Honorary Doctorate of Laws from the University of Alberta, the University of Cape Breton, McMaster University and the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. She is a member of the Order of Canada and the Order of Ontario.
